## Thanksgiving recipe

This is a recipe for cornbread.
The ingredients you'll need are: 1/2 cup butter, 2/3 cup white sugar, 2 eggs, 1 cup buttermilk, 1/2 teaspoon baking soda ,1 cup cornmeal, 1 cup all-purpose flour, and $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt.

First, preheat oven to 375 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease an 8inch square pan. Then, melt butter
in large skillet. Remove from heat and stir in sugar. Quickly add eggs and beat until well blended.

Combine buttermilk with baking soda and stir into mixture in pan. Stir in cornmeal, flour, and salt until well blended and few lumps remain.
Pour batter into prepared pan. Bake in preheated oven for 30 to 40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

With this recipe, you will have delicious cornbread.
