Malcolm X was a minister, human rights activist, and prominent black nationalist leader.


Malcolm fought against racial segregation.

In 1989, she moved to New York to pursue her acting ambitions. During her early time there she ran out of money. She lived in a homeless shelter, but over time she got better.


She was the first African American woman to win an Academy Award. She won it for the movie Monster's Ball.

He is the fourth richest African American.


He impacted my life because he has made Jordan's and they are popular. I want to be like him because he is a role model for young teenagers.
